

Staff worked hard over the lockdown period to produce the grades students were awarded today through a clear and consistent process. The analysis of student work produced prior to lockdown in addition to mock results and classwork were all scrutinised to ensure the grades awarded reflected the achievement and attainment of each student.

Our results are reflective of the improvements that the school made in the summer of 2019. We estimate that around 60% of our students gained passes at GCSE in English and Maths with 76% achieving that grade in English and 65% achieving that standard in maths.
